As an OSHA Nationally Recognized Testing Lab (NRTL) since 1998, NSF International tests, certifies and evaluates electrical equipment for the commercial food equipment, recreational water products, drinking water and waste water.

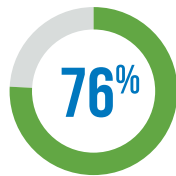
WHAT REGULATIONS REQUIRE

The National Electrical Code (NEC) specifies in Article 90.7 that all electrical equipment be approved. OSHA states in 29 CFR 1910.310 and the NEC states in Article 110.3 that all equipment in the workplace must be listed and labeled by a Nationally Recognized Testing Lab prior to operation of the equipment.

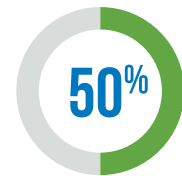

Are likely to buy certified items

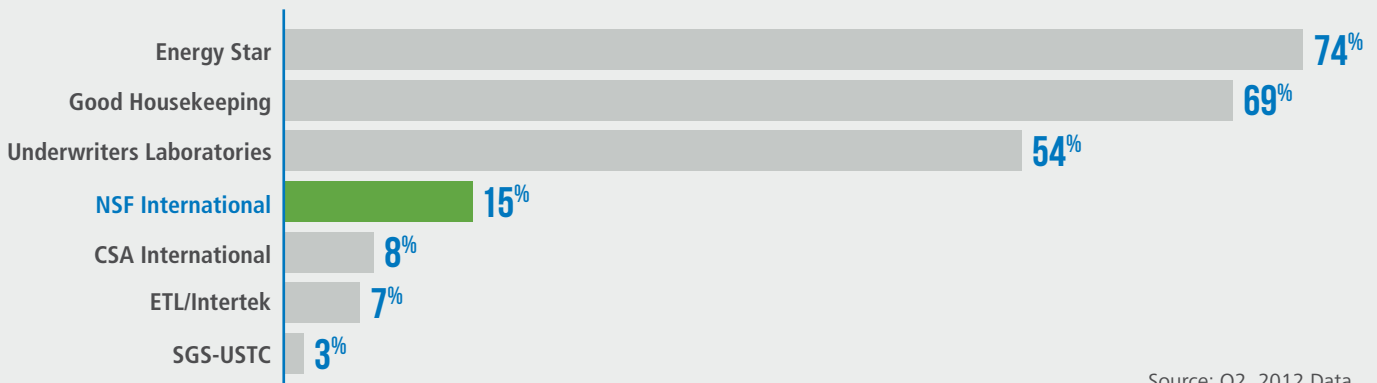


Look for certification when purchasing electronics
